Job Summary	The Early Childhood Clinician I/Disability Specialist provides support and services to organizational early childhood programs in accordance with Early Head Start federal regulations and guidelines. The EC Clinician I/Disability Specialist works closely with educational staff and staff who work closely with families providing an array of services along the continuum of child mental health primary prevention, early intervention and treatment, integrates a whole child and family approach with the understanding that families, classrooms, and other early childhood settings have a significant impact on the well-being and social/emotional development of a young child. The EC Clinician I/Disability Specialist also provides assistance in the oversight of Individual Education Plans of Early Head Start children. Functions include assisting in the development, modification, and implementation of Early Head Start curriculum and effective practices for special education students according to the Early Head Start regulations. Assist in coordinating on-going relationships with therapeutic specialists such as speech and play therapy. Assist in providing the ongoing monitoring and record keeping systems for the Early Head Start Disability department in accordance with policies and procedures. Services may be provided in classroom, office, home, or other community settings.
