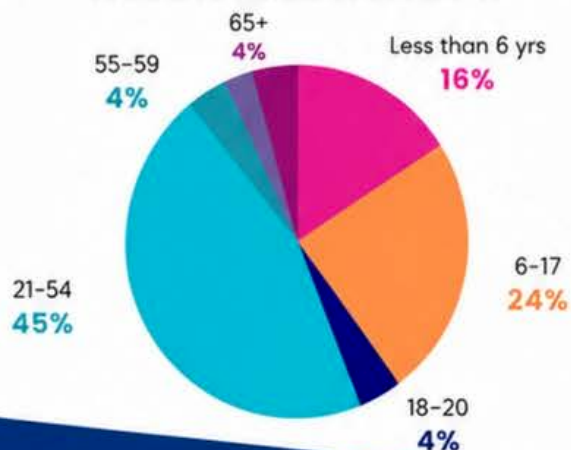

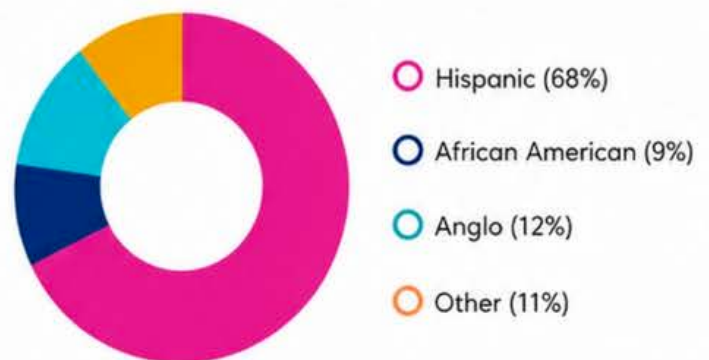

WHAT ARE SOCIAL DETERMINANTS OF HEALTH?

Social determinants of health (SDOH) are the conditions in the environments where people are born, live, learn, work, play, worship, and age that affect health, functioning, and quality of life. Family Service centers its work on these determinants to address root causes of instability and improve long-term outcomes for individuals and families. Family Service follows the Healthy People 2030 Model.

By addressing all five pillars, Family Service delivers holistic, integrated services that empower individuals, stabilize families, and strengthen neighborhoods across San Antonio and 16 counties.

EDUCATION



Family Service's Education Pillar brings the theme of **Stronger Foundations** and **Healthier Futures** to life by supporting youth and families in building the skills, confidence, and connections needed for long-term success. Through a focus on attendance, behavior, academic achievement, and college and career readiness, programs help young people strengthen math, reading, digital, and life skills while also promoting healthy decision-making and drug prevention. At the same time, caregivers are equipped with stronger parenting skills, reinforcing a supportive home environment that sustains youth success. Central to this work is the emphasis on developmental relationships, where youth experience genuine care, encouragement, and opportunities for growth from trusted staff. Insights gathered through tools like the Search Institute's Developmental Survey provide a deeper understanding of each young person's sense of belonging, resilience, and potential—ensuring that every outcome not only reflects academic progress, but also advances social, emotional, and lifelong well-being.





These outcomes reflect the impact of Family Service's Education Pillar in advancing **Stronger Foundations** and **Healthier Futures**. From improved attendance and increased interest in future pathways to reduced substance use and behavior challenges, youth are making meaningful progress. Together, these results show how the right support helps young people stay engaged, make healthier choices, and move toward brighter futures.



Among youth identified as chronically absent, **100% showed measurable improvement in attendance based on report card and self-surveys.**



Through our focus on college and career readiness, and youth participated in surveys measuring their future aspirations, and **90% reported an increased interest in attending college, joining the military, or entering the workforce**—highlighting how intentional guidance and exposure can inspire young people to envision and pursue meaningful paths toward their future.



Among identified youth participants in our programs that completed post-surveys, **98% reported a decrease in alcohol, tobacco, and other drug use** as well as reduced conduct problems.

Digital Empowerment is one of many initiatives Family Service offers within our Rural Services programs to help individuals and families build stronger, healthier, and more self-sufficient lives.

The primary goal of the Digital Empowerment work in the rural area is focused around ensuring everyone has the resources, skills, and access to technology. This refers to everyone having access to devices, reliable Internet, and having the skills to operate the device and navigate the digital world. We know that to fully function today, we must be properly equipped to survive. Our efforts include providing operable devices like laptops and/or tablets, hot spots to ensure connectivity, and opportunities to learn the skills needed to be successful.

The services provided were not necessarily aimed at specific population, they have been geared to serve those that have a need. There has been a mix of students, young adults, and the older population. All needs have been different.

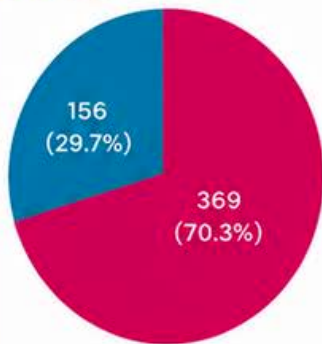

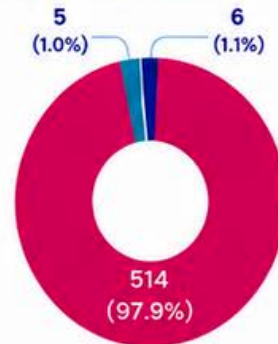

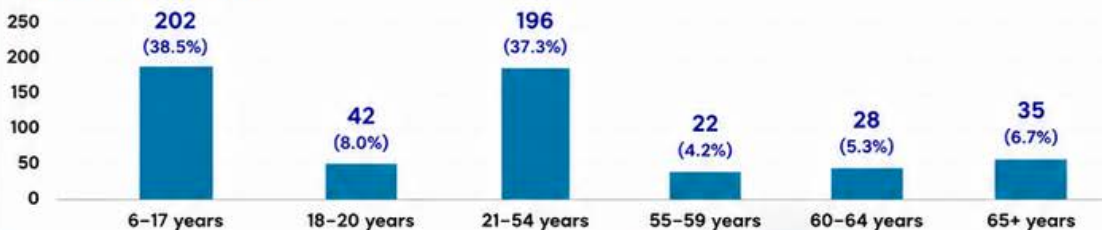

AGE DISTRIBUTION

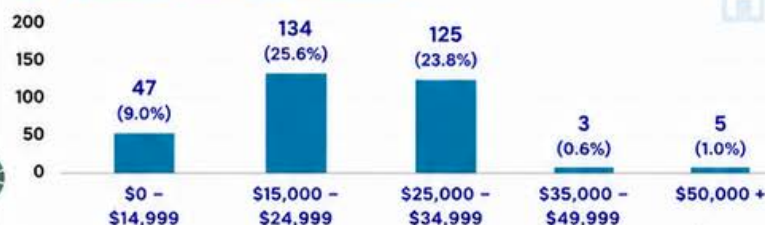

HEAD START ANNUAL REPORT

At Family Service, our commitment to strengthening families begins with our youngest learners. Through our Head Start and Early Head Start programs, we provide high-quality, comprehensive services designed to support children from six weeks to five years of age during their most critical stages of development. Grounded in a whole-family approach, our model goes beyond early education—integrating health, wellbeing, nutrition, and family support and wraparound services to ensure every child has the foundation they need to thrive.

During the program year spanning August 2024 through June 2025, our Head Start programs demonstrated both growth and impact. **While funded to serve 1,126 children, Head start and Early Head Start maintained more than a 97 percent enrollment rate across our community.** Of these, 379 children were supported through Early Head Start, where consistent engagement remained a priority, reflected in an average daily attendance rate of 85.21%. **Our Head Start program also maintained strong participation, with an average daily attendance rate of 87.76%.**

These numbers represent more than participation—they reflect the trust families place in our programs and the dedication of our staff and partners who work tirelessly to deliver meaningful, equitable services. As you explore this annual report, you will see how our integrated approach continues to uplift children, empower families, and build a stronger, healthier community for San Antonio.

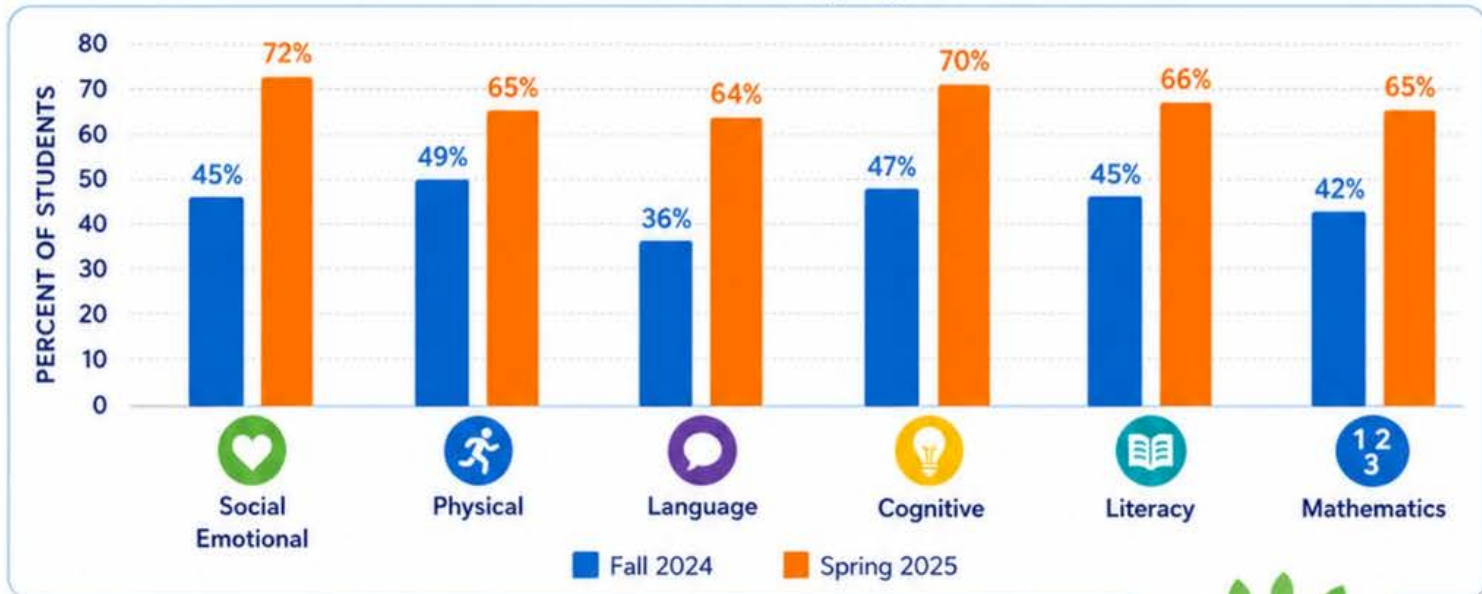
The Average Infant CLASS Scores for the 2024–2025 school year highlight the strength and consistency of classroom interactions across key developmental areas. Scores in Relational Climate (6.05) and Teacher Sensitivity (5.94) reflect particularly strong, nurturing relationships between caregivers and infants, creating a secure foundation for learning. Responsive Caregiving (5.44) also demonstrates a high level of attentiveness to children's needs. Meanwhile, Facilitated Exploration (4.87) and Early Language Support (4.91) show solid performance with opportunities for continued growth in encouraging discovery and communication. Overall, these results underscore a high-quality learning environment committed to supporting infants' healthy development and early learning experiences.

LASTING IMPACT

Family Service is committed to ensuring all children have access to high-quality early education and the supports they need to thrive. During the 2024–2025 program year, comprehensive services were provided to children with diverse developmental needs across both Early Head Start and Head Start programs.

In **Early Head Start**, 23 children ages 6 weeks to 36 months with diagnosed disabilities received specialized services aligned with their Individualized Family Service Plans (IFSPs). An additional 125 children were identified with developmental concerns through ongoing screenings and received targeted support, including monitoring, referrals, and individualized strategies.

Within Head Start, 130 children with diagnosed disabilities were supported alongside 198 children with identified developmental concerns. Through strong partnerships with local school districts, children ages three to five received access to evaluations, eligibility services, and individualized supports through Individualized Education Programs (IEPs), ensuring they receive the services necessary for continued growth and school readiness.



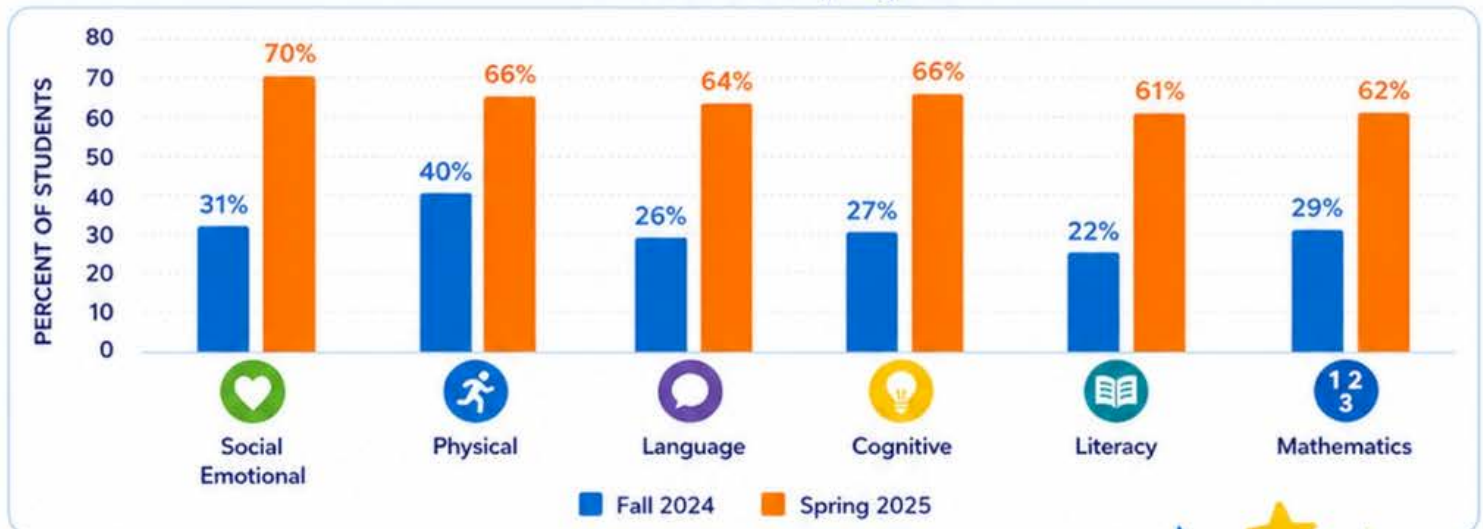

LASTING IMPACT

At Family Service Head Start, we are committed to preparing every child for a successful transition to kindergarten. Using the Creative Curriculum, we support development across key areas including **social-emotional**, **physical**, **language**, **cognitive**, **literacy**, and **mathematics**, ensuring children meet widely held expectations for their age.

Teachers conduct ongoing observations throughout the year to guide individualized instruction and support each child’s growth. During the 2024–2025 program year, students demonstrated progress across all domains, with the strongest gains in **cognitive** and **social-emotional** development in both Early Head Start and Head Start. Research shows these skills are linked to higher graduation rates and college attendance, reinforcing that our students are on a strong path toward long-term academic success.
